Dear Band Parents and Students,

Welcome to a new year of great music with the Freeman band program! Time will sail by this summer and before we know it, Band Camp will be upon us. This letter contains a lot of important information, so please read it carefully and review all of the information in our Band Camp Essentials area of our website as soon as possible. I hope you can take a few minutes on the first morning of full Band Camp, Monday, August 16th, to stop in and say hello from 8-8:30am. Students, you will start at 8 am *sharp*!

The Band Camp Staff, most of whom the returning students already know, is well under way preparing the 2010 Rebel Brigade Field Show. This year's show is entitled "The Dance" and features several different styles of dance music from classical to modern. Our website, www.freemanband.org, will soon have the music available for you to download. Music was handed out at the end of the past school year, however, if you don't have it, keep checking the site and, when available, download the music and start familiarizing yourself with the piece. **Section Leaders and Captains should have all of the music memorized by the start of Band Camp!** I am happy to announce that the drill (marching patterns) for this year's show is even almost complete.

Everyone's role in this band is equally important, both musically and visually. The calendar for the year is also being updated. For the fall, we will play at all home football games, several away games, one clinic and at least three competitions. A tentative schedule has been posted on the website.

Band Camp will be held on campus at Freeman. We will be using the outfield area of the baseball field to learn drill and we will be in the band room (and other sections of Green Acres) for music rehearsals. In addition to band camp, we will be having a weekly music rehearsal on Monday evenings this summer in the band room. If you are in town, the expectation is that you come to rehearsal. Section Leaders and Drum Majors will be contacting their sections to remind them about these rehearsals throughout the summer.

All Students (Band & Guard) Report at 5:00pm

As you all know, marching band is an athletic activity and a lot of time is spent outside, beginning with Band Camp. Even though we try to limit our outside time to the mornings when it is cooler, the weather in August will be hot and humid, so to ensure productive rehearsals, some precautions must be taken.

First, appropriate dress is crucial. Students should wear light-colored t-shirts, shorts of appropriate length, hats, sunglasses if desired and comfortable sneakers with socks. **No sandals or flip-flops, and no bare feet!** A water-resistant sunscreen is *strongly* recommended. **Please keep in mind that the dress code stipulated in the Henrico County Code of Conduct does apply!**

Second, what you eat and drink (or don't eat and drink) will directly affect your ability to rehearse, and thus affect the overall band's productivity. The Boosters will provide coolers of water, though all students should bring their own water as well. **Keeping yourself properly hydrated is of utmost importance!** Also, be sure to eat a good breakfast every morning.

All students need to bring their own lunch (lots of fruits and lighter foods). **No one will be allowed to leave school grounds during Band Camp hours.** And again, students should drink plenty of non-carbonated fluids.

Each student must be fully prepared for camp with the following items each day:

Please be sure to have these items on the first day of camp.

1. Instrument and accessories such as reeds, valve oil, etc.
2. Pencil with an eraser
3. Sturdy three-ring binder with sheet protectors and loose-leaf paper
4. Red, White & Blue Poker chips (to help in learning drill)
5. Your music
6. Percussionists should have fully equipped stick bags (see letter from Matt)

We are happy to be able to maintain the fee for Band Camp 2010 at \$150 for all Band and Color Guard students. This partially funds special instructors for each section (not paid for by the County), one Rebel Brigade T-shirt specifically designed for our 2010 field show, drinks provided by the Boosters, and the main course for the picnic.

The Band Camp fee and other forms (available on the website) are due by July 12th, at the summer music rehearsal. There is a payment form which explains a few other fees, such as marching shoes and gloves, if needed, and color guard shoes, gloves and equipment fee, that are due with the forms on July 12th as well.

Our transportation fee (which covers the cost of chartered buses to one of our competitions) is due by September 15th.

The DSF Band Boosters provide critical funding for our program during the year, as well as volunteer support to make the program happen. Please join this important group and become an active member. The membership form and fees can be included in all your July 12th forms.

If payment is not possible by the due date, please call Andrew Jeretina at 440-8490 to set up an alternate payment plan. We are always more than willing to be flexible as long as a good faith effort is made. **Anyone who has not paid the Band Camp fee or has not contacted Mr. Jeretina will not be permitted to attend camp until this obligation has been met.**

One last note: Please send us your email address asap so we can prepare to start sending you schedule changes, reminders, etc. – just send an email to vobrien@vtla.com with your name and the student’s name.

Our goal for Band Camp 2010 is to have the show well under way for the performance and picnic **on Tuesday, August 31st at 6:00pm**, so come ready to work hard and be successful. This is going to be a great year!
